Regular Meeting**

The Board of Directors for the Asotin County Public Facilities District in the County of Asotin, State of Washington, met this date.

1) Call to order

Connie Morrow called the meeting to order at 4:15 p.m.

2) Comments from the Public

Public comments were made.

3) Consent Agenda

May’s voucher packet, APPKT09782, totaling \$215,391.85, was reviewed by the Board. April expense voucher(s) and payroll warrant numbers with summarized totals and 28 April 2026 meeting minutes were also presented to the members.

Diana Kottkey motioned to approve the consent agenda. Brandon Berglund seconded the motion.

4) Aquatic Center Reports

Jessica West discussed the All-Staff meeting and preparations for the waterpark’s Opening Day, 13 Jun, along with the summer pass sale commencing Thurs, 11 Jun. Local schools’ end-of-year rentals are scheduled through the second week in June. West then invited the Board to Concessions’ Family & Friends night on Fri, 5 Jun, an event geared to give new employees a little real-world experience. West reminded the Board that the facility is closed for two federal holidays during the summer season: Juneteenth and Independence Day. Teachers and their family will get in for Family Night prices on Educators’ Appreciation Day, Sat, 27 Jun; in addition, WWCC will be using the facility for robotics testing in July. Finally, West went over Customer Comments and the Usage Report.

Danelle Bame went over vouchers and financials while answering questions. She then provided updates regarding that status of the State Auditor and Dept of Ret Systems audits.

Scott Stoll announced that sampling from the new espresso cart will be available at the next meeting. He also informed the Board that due to limitations with the current POS software, he is reviewing other recreational software options

Stoll next presented the Board with the architect's updated estimate for Concessions' construction. Due to the significant cost increase, the Board chose to table further discussion to the next work session. Stoll will bring options for the Board to review.

5) Comments from Directors

Breglund asked Stoll if he had been able to follow up with a patron regarding a request. Morrow said she had bumped into her at a local store and provided the update. The patron understood but then asked if grab bars could be a viable option. Stoll will look into.

6) Unfinished Business

The Board reviewed how the last 3 months with the revised schedule format had worked. After discussion, Berglund motioned to replace the 2nd Tuesday (voucher) meetings with a work sessions and approve/sign vouchers at the general meeting on the 4th Tuesday of each month. Kottkey seconded. Vote: 4 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstention. Motion passed.

Morrow and Stoll still plan to meet with the City of Clarkston Council regarding potential funding.

Stoll said registration for the informational breakfast on Tues, 16 Jun, was open. The breakfast will be limited to 20-25 and that the Chamber of Commerce is assisting with sign ups.

7) New Business

The Board considered future expansion opportunities. Following discussion, Nick Hardin motioned to allow Stoll to investigate options in developing a sports-centric activity center. Berglund seconded. Vote: 4 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstention. Motion passed.


Morrow announced that Michael Burtis was resigning from his #5 County Board position. Price Mars received his official resignation letter earlier in the day. Due to previous lack of consistency, the Board decided to discuss a definitive process as an agenda item at the next work session.


Hardin asked about the status of billboard of Bridge/15th. Stoll answered that it was to have been updated 6 months ago, but Marketing was experiencing difficulty in finding someone to do the work.

8) Adjournment

Hardin motioned to adjourn the meeting. Berglund seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned at 5:47 p.m.
